Honor Your Parents Exodus 20:12 (NASB)

Honor. The basic sense is "to treat someone with <u>respect</u> because they carry a <u>heavyweight</u> of <u>authority</u>."

Note: This commandment to "honor" is in <u>force</u> regardless of how your parents <u>perform</u>.

Note: Your parents' <u>failure</u> to be all they should have been does not <u>excuse</u> you from <u>obeying</u> the Fifth Commandment.

Question: Why are all these serious warnings in the Bible about honoring your parents?

Answer: Because your parents stand in the place of God in your life.

Four Reasons to Honor Your Parents:

1) It's the <u>right thing</u> to do. (Eph 6:1)

2) It pleases God. (Col 3:20)

3) It leads to long life. (Ex 20:12)

4) It ensures good success. (Deut 5:16)

Question: How do we honor our parents?

Answer: In the grow-up years, you honor your parents through obedience. (Eph 6:1)
In the mature years, you honor your parents by making provision for their material needs and taking care of them
