"The Cost of Forgiveness" Luke 23:34 April 3, 2016

Two ways crucifixion differs from our forms of execution today:

- 1. Executions today are, for the most part, private events.
- 2. Executions today are swift and merciful.

Unpacking Jesus' prayer of forgiveness (Luke 23:34)

- 1. Jesus addresses His prayer to the Father.
- 2. Jesus' prayer involved a <u>specific request.</u>
 The Greek word we translate "forgive" has three shades of meaning in Luke 23:34.
 - a. The word "forgive" expresses the idea of <u>letting go of debt</u> by not <u>demanding it's payment.</u>
 - b. The word "forgive" also means to permit.
 - c. The word 'forgive" is in the <u>imperfect tense</u> indicating that Jesus prayed this prayer <u>more than once.</u>
- 3. Jesus' prayer includes an <u>object</u> in His request.
- 4. Jesus' prayer has a <u>purpose</u> to His request.
