## "Welcome to Romans"

Romans 1:1-7 August 6, 2017

What is the theme of the Book of Romans? The gospel (Ro 1:1,9,15,16,17) What does the word "gospel" mean? It means good news.

Outline for the Book of Romans:

- 1. The gospel is God's good news for sinners. (Ro 1-8)
- 2. The gospel is God's good news for <u>Israel.</u> (Ro 9-11)
- 3. The gospel is God's good news for your life. (Ro 12-16)

Three-fold Introduction (Ro 1:1)

- 1. Paul introduces his Master He is a "bondservant of Jesus Christ."
- 2. Paul introduces his office He is "called to be an apostle".
- 3. Paul introduces his <u>purpose</u> He is "separated to the gospel".

Paul's Introduction (cont.)

- 1. He introduces himself as a "bondservant of Jesus Christ."
  - "Bondservant" means— <u>á slave by choice</u>
- 2. He introduces himself as "called to be an apostle."
  - "Apostle" means— <u>a person who is sent</u>
- 3. He introduces himself as separated to the gospel of God.

"Separated" means— to be selected out of a group for a purpose

Paul's message is the gospel and the gospel was promised in the Old Testament. (Ro 1:2)

The two natures of Jesus Christ:

- 1. His human nature. (v.3)
- 2. His divine nature. (4)

What was the key event in verse 4 that demonstrates who Jesus Christ really is? The resurrection from the dead.

Paul's philosophy of ministry in three simple statements (Ro 1:5.6)

- 1. His message was the gospel.
- 2. His mission was the world.
- 3. His goal was winning people to faith in Jesus Christ and helping them to mature in Him.

Three truths about our identify:

- 1. We are <u>loved by God.</u> (v.7a
- 2. We are <u>called to be saints.</u> (v.7.b)
- 3. We are recipients of God's grace and peace. (v.7c)
