## Without Excuse

Romans 1:18-20 August 27, 2017

The gospel of Jesus Christ is the theme of the entire epistle to the Romans. (v. 16, 17)

"For the **wrath of God** is revealed from heaven...." (v.18)
God's wrath is His settled hostility to everything that contradicts His holiness.

"For the wrath of God is **revealed** from heaven....." (v.18)

The word "revealed" in v.18 is in the present tense because it describes something that is  $\underline{\text{always}}$  going on.

The wrath of God is being constantly revealed.

"For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all **ungodliness** and **unrighteousness** of men...." (v.18)

- 1. Ungodliness focuses on man's relationship to <u>God.</u>
  It refers to a lack of <u>reverence</u> a lack of <u>devotion</u>, a lack of <u>worship</u> that leads to idolatry.
- 2. Unrighteousness focuses on man's relationship to <u>others.</u>
  When you are not <u>rightly</u> related to God, then your relationship with others <u>suffers</u> as well.

"For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who **suppress the truth** in unrighteousness...."

The word "suppress" means to <u>deliberately reject</u> the truth in the face of <u>overwhelming evidence</u> to the contrary.

Question: What truth in v. 19 & 20 is so universally obvious

that everyone knows it?

Answer: The revelation of God. (v.19, 20)

The Lord has revealed Himself to all people everywhere in two ways:

- 1. The Lord has revealed Himself in a person's internal conscience. (v.19)
- 2. The Lord has revealed Himself through external creation. (v.20)
