Romans 3:27-31

Implications of justification by faith:

1. Justification by faith eliminates any boasting or human pride. (v. 27, 28)

Question: Does salvation begin with man or does it begin with God? Answer: It begins with <u>God alone</u>. If salvation is truly a work of <u>God's grace</u> then it must, of <u>necessity</u>, begin with <u>Him</u>.

Question: Why is Christianity a "done" religion? Answer: Because Jesus Christ did <u>everything necessary</u> for our <u>salvation</u> when He died on a cross.

HOW CAN I BE SAVED?

DO	DONE
"Do this and live."	"It is finished."
"Try harder and you'll make it."	"Stop trying and start trusting."
'Earned."	"A gift."
"Work to gain it."	"Free for the asking."

"For we maintain that a man is justified by faith *alone* apart from works of the Law." (Martin Luther Translation of Ro 3:28)

Why is that important? Because it eliminates human pride and any boasting.

II. Justification by faith rejects any <u>social</u> or <u>racial</u> distinctions. (v.29, 30)

III. Justification by faith does not <u>nullify</u> the Law; it <u>establishes</u> the Law. (v. 31)

NOTES: What does Paul mean when he says that his teaching "establishes" the Law? He means that the teaching of justification by faith alone puts the Law of God in its proper place.

Justification by faith upholds the Law in at least four ways:

- 1. The Law <u>shows</u> us <u>our sin</u>.
- 2. The Law <u>shows</u> us <u>our need</u> for Christ.
- 3. The Law was <u>fulfilled</u> by <u>Christ</u>.

4. The Law is <u>fulfilled</u> in us by the <u>power</u> of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>.
