## Dead to Sin Romans 6:1-7ESV

Justifications: The act whereby God declares you righteous in His eyes.

<u>Sanctification</u>: The act whereby God <u>makes</u> you righteous.

Antinomianism: Against the law.

Question: What tense is "died to sin"? Past tense

What does the phrase "died to sin" mean? It means that you have been set free from the <u>ruling power</u> of sin.

Here's the truth about the Christian's relationship to sin: The true believer <u>cannot sin</u> and <u>stay happy</u>.

Question: What happens to the Christian who chooses to remain in sin?

- 1. It won't work. (v. 1,2)
- 2. God may judge you. (Heb 10:26-31)
- 3. If you persist in sin <u>forever</u>; it demonstrates that you <u>never were</u> a believer. (1 Jo 3:7-10)

Three personal applications:

- 1. We must <u>know</u> that we are <u>identified</u> with Christ. (v. 3,4)

  The word "baptism" means <u>to immerse</u> or <u>to dip</u> and the symbol behind the person is identification with Christ.
- 2. We are to grow in our relationship with Christ. (v.5)
- 3. We are to show our freedom in Christ. (v. 6.7)

The phrase "brought to nothing" means "rendered powerless".
