"Do Something Great" 2 Timothy 4:7 (NASB)

"Drink offering:" - It's a word that refers to the offering of the <u>sacrifice</u> at the end of the sacrifice to culminate the entire <u>sacrificial</u> event.

What was Paul's "drink offering"? Paul's "drink offering" was die for Christ.

Question: What does the word "departure" mean? It's a word used for <u>loosening</u> the <u>mooring ropes</u> of a ship. It was a term used for <u>death</u>.

Three Reasons Why Paul was Ready for His Departure:

- 1. <u>He fought the good fight</u>. (v.7a) "Fight" is an athletic term from which we get the word <u>agonize</u>.
- 2. <u>He finished the course</u>. (v.7b)

 The word "course" refers to the <u>running of a race</u>.
- 3. <u>He kept the faith</u>. (v.7c) "The faith" was always a reference to the <u>scripture</u>.
