# No Guarantees Judges 13:1-25

#### Amazing News from an Angel: (v. 2-5)

- 1. You are about to have a <u>baby</u> even though you are <u>sterile</u>.
- 2. Don't drink any wine.
- 3. Don't eat anything unclean.
- 4. When he's born, don't <u>cut</u> his hair.
- 5. He's going to be a Nazarite.
- 6. He will begin to <u>deliver</u> Israel from the Philistines.

#### Nazarite Vow: (Numbers 6)

- 1. He was not to <u>drink wine</u> or any other <u>intoxicating</u> drink.
- 2. He was not to touch a dead body.
- 3. He was not to <u>cut</u> his hair.

NOTE: The purpose of the Nazarite vow was to provide a way in which an <u>ordinary (non-priestly) person</u> could dedicate his life to God.

## Two Important Things about Samson's Childhood:

- 1. The blessing of God rests on Samson even as a young child.
- 2. The Spirit of God began to stir Samson as a teenager.

# NOTE: Judges 13 is meant to impress us with the fact that here is a man completely prepared to do great things for God.

- If ever a man should have succeeded, it was Samson.
- If ever a man had it all, it was Samson.
- If ever a man had <u>all the advantages</u> life can offer, it was Samson.

# Consider these facts about Samson:

- 1. His birth was <u>announced</u> by an angel of the Lord.
- 2. He was set apart to God as a Nazarite from birth.
- 3. His mission in life was <u>chosen</u> by God—to begin to <u>deliver</u> His people.
- 4. He was raised in a godly home by godly parents who wanted to cooperate with God.
- 5. He was <u>blessed</u> as a young child.
- 6. He was empowered by the Spirit of God.

Note to Parents: There is no <u>guarantee</u> concerning how your children are going to turn out. In other words, <u>godly</u> parents do not always produce <u>godly</u> children.

Note to parents with rebellious adult children:

- 1. <u>Don't despair</u>. Even though your children <u>aren't serving</u> the Lord right now, that doesn't mean they can't change later.
- 2. Don't <u>blame</u> yourself for what your children freely choose to do.

### Application:

If you grew up in a godly home, hold fast to those Biblical values your parents tried to instill in you and it will save you a lot of heartache.

*Note*: If you aren't going the right way, take heart—you can be <u>forgiven</u>.
