

- The "English" 4 Part Order (governed by genre)
  - Law
  - History
  - Wisdom
  - Prophecy
- The Hebrew 3 Part Order(s) (governed by theology(ies))
  - Torah (Law)
  - Prophets
  - Writings

WHY IS THE 3 PART ORDER REALLY ORDERS?


- The Torah
  - Always set the same: Gen, Exo, Lev, Num, Deut
- The Prophets
  - Order 1 Jos, Jud, Sam, Kin + **Isa**, Jer, Ezk, 12
  - Order 2 Jos, Jud, Sam, Kin + Jer, Ezk, **Isa**, 12
- The Writings
  - Order 1 Psa, Job, Prov, Ruth, Song, Eccl, Lam, Est, Dan, Ezr, Neh, Chron
  - Order 2 Ruth, Psa, Job, Prov, Eccl, Song, Lam, Dan, Est, Ezr, Neh, Chron
  - Order 3 Psa, Prov, Job, Song, Rut, Lam, Eccl, Est, Dan, Ezr, Neh, Chron
  - Order 4 Chron, Psa, Job, Prov, Rut, Song, Eccl, Lam, Est, Dan, Ezr, Neh
- Different Orders Reflect Different Ways of Reading
- Different Ways of Reading Come From Different Theologies
- Key Questions
  - Which order came first and is more likely to be intended by an "author" of the OT canon?
  - Which explains most of the connections between books?
  - Will we stay humble while we think about this?
  - Do I have to come to an answer? No.

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### THE TORAH IS ONE BOOK (NOT FIVE)


- Torah
  - Instruction (what is taught)
  - Law (legal codes)
  - Customer or manner (what is lived)
- Pentateuch
  - Five fold book ... not five books
  - Five Part Book or Five Volume Book
- Book or Books?
  - Jos 8:31; 23:6; 24:26
  - 2 Kings 14:6
  - Ezra 7:6
  - Neh 8:1; 13:1
  - 2 Chr 34:14; 35:12





THE TORAH (ACCORDING TO THE PROPHETS & WRITINGS)

- 2 Main Comparisons
  - Adam and Israel common problem: man's death in God's presence
    - Adam's story prepares us to read Israel's story
    - Israel's story is the tutor for what it means to live life close to God
  - Abraham and Moses two models on approaching and being near God
    - Abraham **before the law** by faith in the seed who will bring man to the land where God dwells (return)
    - Moses under the law (exile)
- 2 Main Patterns
  - Narrative-Poetry-Epilogue eschatology
  - Covenant-Stipulation-Failure ethics

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THE TORAH: EXILE AND RETURN

### PROBLEM/ DILEMMA / BIG QUESTION

The heart of man is so filled with sin that it leaves man in exile from God both physically and spiritually: man's death in God's presence.

#### SOLUTION/ HOPE/ MESSAGE

In the end of days,

the seed of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob,

the seed promised to Adam and Eve,

and the King from the tribe of Judah who will serve as the Prophet like Moses and the Word of God Israel asked for at Sinai,

<u>will come</u> to circumcise the hearts of man in the sending of His Spirit and the overcoming of man's death so that Israel and the nations may return to God and live with Him forever, eating from the tree of life in a garden and a promised land that covers the whole creation with the glory and face of God.

#### THE OT AND THE NT: ONE BOOK OR TWO?

- In what way should we consider the Bible to be one book and/or two books?
- Do the NT and OT offer the same message?
- What is the NT's understanding of the OT?
- Do the writers of the NT "reinterpret" the OT with a new meaning as apostles?
- Do the writers of the NT "exegete" the OT according to the OT authors' intentions?


### WHAT HOLDS THE OT AND NT TOGETHER?

- Allegory / Typology / Figuration
  - Patterns ... from the author or reader?
- Thematic Unity
  - Common themes ... common messages?
- Promise and Fulfillment
  - OT asks the question; NT gives the answer
- Canonical
  - Unity through how the text has been read by the church
- Progressive Revelation/ Salvation History
  - Either new information or new events draw out new meanings in the old text ... relationship to the OT author?
- Exegetical
  - The NT rightly interprets the OT according to the intentions of the OT author
  - NT as "sermon(s)" on the OT


